U.K. Minister Pulls Back on Threat to BBC

By ESHE NELSON

Over the weekend, a British government minister tried to deal a death blow to the main source of funding for the BBC, a license fee charged each year to any household with a TV.

Nadine Dorries, who oversees the BBC in the cabinet, said on Twitter that an imminent announcement about the license fee "will be the last." But by Monday afternoon, standing in the House of Commons in Parliament, she walked back her contentious claim as she announced that the license fee would be frozen for the next two years — a move that could require substantial budget cuts at the public broadcaster just to keep up with fast inflation.

The funding freeze is "disappointing," Richard Sharp, the BBC's chairman, and Tim Davie, the director-general, said in a statement, and will "necessitate tougher choices."

For four years from April 2024, the fee will rise again in line with inflation, Ms. Dorries said. The BBC and the government have been in negotiations since late 2020 over the amount that TV owners must pay over the next five years. For the past five years, the fee has increased in line with inflation annually.

"This is a very good result compared to alternative results, including the elimination of the license fee" and additional belowinflation increases, said Claire Enders, founder of Enders Analysis, a media research firm

(\$5.1 billion), comes from the license fee, which is currently £159 (\$217) per household. The fee was introduced in 1923 to pay for radio. Now it funds eight national TV channels, 10 radio stations, local stations (including Welsh and Gaelic language services), educational content and on-demand services. Fourteen percent of the license fee funds non-BBC TV.

Ms. Dorries, the culture secretary, and fellow Conservatives have argued that the BBC needs an overhaul in how it is funded. They have also said it is too leftleaning and London-centric.

"The days of the elderly being threatened with prison sentences and bailiffs knocking on doors are over," Ms. Dorries said on Twitter on Sunday. "Time now to discuss and debate new ways of funding, supporting and selling great British content."

In Parliament on Monday, in a more conciliatory tone and citing the BBC's "unique place in our cultural heritage," Ms. Dorries said that "it's time to begin asking those really serious questions" about the funding of the BBC and whether the license fee was appropriate. But she wasn't stating a policy. "We are announcing a debate and a discussion," she said.

The BBC's license fee funding is guaranteed until the end of 2027, after which the its Royal Charter expires and its mission, public purpose and funding method need to be renewed. Terms will be decided with the government of the day. But before then there will be a general election.

In Britain, inflation is at its high-

est level in a decade, and freezing the license fee could require the broadcaster to make even more cuts. Ms. Dorries said any increase couldn't be justified while millions of households were squeezed by rising energy bills and consumer prices. The Conservative government is also raising taxes in April to fund more health services.

Since 2016, the BBC has undertaken a vast cost-cutting plan, trying to save £800 million annually. This fiscal year, it expects the sav-

ings to rise above £950 million. Last year, it cut 1,200 jobs.

The changes have come amid an overhaul of the BBC's leadership. Since late 2020, a new director-general and chairman have been installed. Deborah Turness, who was president of NBC News, will be the next director of news.

After complaints about bias in its news coverage, the broadcaster announced a plan last year to spend an additional £700 million

outside London by 2027 and relocate 400 jobs.

The broadcaster has been facing increasing pressure, and not just from the government. The BBC is trying to reach a more diverse and younger audience while cutting costs, as big-budget streaming companies such as Netflix and Spotify expand.

On the future of the BBC's funding and purpose, Mr. Sharp and Mr. Davie said that while all options should be considered, "the BBC is owned by the public, and their voice must always be the loudest when it comes to determining the BBC's future.'

In Britain, the debate around the fee often focuses on the BBC's news service, and whether everyone should be required to pay for it, said Meera Selva, the deputy director of the Reuters Institute for the Study of Journalism at the University of Oxford. The BBC also broadcasts other content, including documentaries and dramas. When schools closed during the pandemic, it also increased children's educational output.

Alternative funding ideas include a direct grant from the government, a subscription service or a membership system that makes its content available to everyone for free but is funded by willing members. But unlike, say, Netflix, the BBC is being asked to provide many different services and is required to provide content that might not be commercially viable, Ms. Selva said.

"The license fee," she said, "is the closest model we have for preserving editorial independence."

Rejected Thrice, Unilever Again Attempts to Acquire Venture of Glaxo and Pfizer

LONDON — The company behind Advil, ChapStick and Tums is the target of the first big multibilliondollar takeover fight of 2022.

Unilever said on Monday that it remained interested in buying the maker of those products, a joint venture of GlaxoSmithKline and Pfizer, after its previous takeover bids had been rejected.

"GSK Consumer Health would be a strong strategic fit," Unilever said in a statement, adding that a deal "would also deliver value and certainty for the shareholders of GSK and Pfizer."

Monday's announcement was effectively a signal of intent that Unilever was willing to pursue one of the costliest takeover fights in the consumer health business in recent years. On Saturday, GlaxoSmithKline said it had rejected Unilever's three previous takeover bids — the most recent of which was 50 billion pounds, or \$68 billion — for "fundamentally" undervaluing the business.

A spokesman for GlaxoSmith-Kline declined to comment on Unilever's Monday announcement, and referred to his company's previous statement. GlaxoSmith-Kline owns about 68 percent of the

Investors had speculated about potential takeover approaches for the GlaxoSmithKline business for months. GlaxoSmithKline had announced plans to spin off the joint venture into a separate publicly traded company, though some of its shareholders have pushed it to consider an outright sale in hopes of fetching more money.

The business was born in 2019 when GlaxoSmithKline and Pfizer closed on a deal to combine their consumer health divisions, as part of efforts to concentrate their resources on higher-margin prescription drugs. The joint venture instantly became a giant in the world of pain relievers, toothpastes, cold treatments and more: GlaxoSmithKline said over the weekend that the business colyear, or around \$13 billion.

But GlaxoSmithKline has been under pressure to rapidly improve its business prospects. The British health giant has faced criticism from Elliott Management, the huge American hedge fund, over its ability to refocus on higher-margin pharmaceuticals.

A spokeswoman for Elliott declined to comment on Unilever's takeover effort.

It is unclear whether others will make offers for the joint venture, though the prospect of a bidding war pushed shares in Glaxo-SmithKline up nearly 5 percent in trading on Monday.

For Unilever, a deal would be its latest major effort to revamp its business. Formed in 1930 as an Anglo-Dutch company, Unilever moved two years ago to consolidate its vast consumer goods empire in London. That shift simplified operations — and made it easier for Unilever to buy companies using its own stock.

In its statement on Monday, Unilever said that the cost of major acquisitions would be offset by the selling of lower-growth businesses, and that it would not amass too much debt through takeovers.

At the same time, Unilever, whose shares have fallen 6 percent over the last 12 months, has been under pressure from dissatisfied investors. Last week, one of its biggest shareholders, the investment firm Fundsmith, criticized it for focusing too much on climateand social-focused causes, and said the company had neglected its fundamental businesses.

"A company which feels it has to define the purpose of Hellmann's mayonnaise has in our view clearly lost the plot," Terry Smith, Fundsmith's founder, wrote in his annual letter to investors.

Yet it is unclear that pursuing the GlaxoSmithKline venture would appease Unilever's investors: Shares in Unilever were down nearly 6 percent in trading on Monday.

"I have worked hard to return Credit Suisse to a successful course, and I am proud of what we have achieved together in my short time at the bank," Mr. Horta-Osório said.

Two days before Verizon and AT&T plan to deploy more segments of their new 5G mobile internet technology, leaders of the nation's largest air carriers on Monday warned again that thousands of flights could be grounded by interference from the technology and that "the nation's commerce will grind to a halt."

High-speed 5G internet uses socalled C-band frequencies close to those used by aircraft to measure their altitude. Verizon and AT&T nave argued that the aviation industry had years to upgrade any equipment that might be affected.


